Encyclopedia of the Emergence

A note for all participants in the world of integrating forges (∮forge), who may be thereby participants in the formation of the Encyclopedia of the Emergence:

You are all helping to discover fragments of the emergence of Freeorder and are helping me to record bits of it in "Threads of Freeorder". The Emergence is immense and far beyond the ability of any person or network to comprehend other than a small part. Each abstract description of the Emergence is shaped both by theory and by contact with specific instances. A process of mutual modification continuously shapes general theory and also shapes the process of discovery and description of instances. We will never completely know what we are seeing, but the endless process of finding out is wonderful!

Instances of something vaguely seeming to suggest a freeordering principle at work may be gathered based on nothing more than a sense of suspected similarity, and then in a moment of sudden (perhaps surprising) comprehension the principle that underlies the perceived unity may spring forth. Thus grows the understanding of the Emergence of Freeorder, or simply, the Emergence.

So it was with the gradual development of the name, "Enlightenment", a process that continued and continues long after the time of the events that underlay growing abstract comprehension of something that deserved a name.

The name itself appeared only late in the process, and under that name it was possible for Diderot and his companion investigators and investors to bring together an Encyclopedia of the Enlightenment.

The Encyclopedia of The Emergence (of Freeorder), will not be a single work, as was that of Diderot and his associates. It will never appear as a whole, but it will be itself an emergent, as a cloud of images and ideas rising out of millions of connections among the builders of tens of thousands of forges (freeorder generators).

When we speak of "emergence" we speak of the actualization of the best in humanity, characterized by freeing imaginations, the development of critical minds, the discovery of quest serving balances among kinds of order, and thriving in competitive collaboration while leaving behind combative destructive tribalisms.

The immateriality and unboundability of the Encyclopedia of the Emergence expresses aspects of its essential nature and of the world on which it depends.
