#### A kind of Venture Investors, drivers of Freeorder Emergence

When Anthony Fisher met with F. A. Hayek at the London School of Economics in 1945 there were in the world few ventures researching and teaching about freeorder (under any name). Today, worldwide, in important part due to Fisher's work, there are hundreds. The investment of lives and wealth has been substantial. In 1945, ex-RAF pilot Fisher did not have the money to engage in this work. He solved the problem by building a company to provide the English with chicken.

Chickens and Freedom: Sir Anthony Fisher and his Buxted Chicken Company, founded in England in 1954, played a key part in creating over five hundred free market oriented think tanks, now in almost every country in the world. His start was to smuggle a dozen chicken eggs from Cornell into England decorated as Easter Eggs — only fitting since smugglers of beneficial goods are heroes of freeorder. "Between 330 AD and 1453, Constantinople (modern Istanbul) was the capital of the Roman Empire, otherwise known as the Later Roman Empire, the Eastern Roman Empire, the Mediaeval Roman Empire, or The Byzantine Empire. For most of this time, it was the largest and richest city in Christendom. The territories of which it was the central capital enjoyed better protections of life, liberty and property, and a higher standard of living, than any other Christian territory, and usually compared favourably with the neighbouring and rival Islamic empires.

Abstract. A new system, the Swirlds hashgraph consensus algorithm, is proposed for replicated state machines with guaranteed Byzantine fault tolerance. It achieves fairness, in the sense that it is difficult for an attacker to manipulate which of two transactions will be chosen to be first in the consensus order. It has complete asynchrony, no leaders, no round robin, no proof-of-work, eventual consensus with probability one, and high speed in the absence of faults. It is based on a gossip protocol, in which the participants don't just gossip about transactions. They gossip about gossip. They jointly build a hashgraph reflecting all of the gossip events. This allows Byzantine agreement to be achieved through virtual voting. Alice does not send Bob a vote over the Internet. Instead, Bob calculates what vote Alice would have sent, based on his knowledge of what Alice knows. This yields fair Byzantine agreement

on a total order for all transactions, with very little communication overhead beyond the transactions themselves.

Kofinas was one of the first to recognize the significance of Baird's invention for networks of computers that must maintain trusted agreement about the data they hold.

Baird earned a Ph.D. in computer science at Carnegie Mellon in less than three years, the fastest ever, but it took him another five years of failed attempts to solve the problem of achieving consensus about the state of data commonly held by computers in an extensive worldwide network. His solution is now almost invisibly changing the world. [this speculation can be contested -ls]

Question: Is it the fundamental purpose of a central bank to give government a way to spend without taxing? This is a question not asked in the above paper, but something I'm curious about. -ls

Another question: How can someone be responsible for a debt they did not agree to incur?

Thinking about this places weight on the use of the word "responsible", and thinking about that raises further difficult questions.
