After watching I posted this in the comments:

"There is something different in the way Leemon approaches this. A key moment is when he implies that trust depends on individuals using supercomputers cheap enough to make individuals able to train their own AIs. Leemon thinks in terms of *freeordered* systems, in which multiple small independent designed orders interact to produce an undesignable spontaneous order that serves multiple unknown explorations better than could be done by top-down design."
